


Dear {FIRST_NAME|Friend},

Do You Need a Mask?



After cancelling Feeding Middlesex County's Walk to End Hunger, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic, we wanted to create a project to replace the funds that would have been collected at that event. This is more relevant given the increased amounts of food being distributed by the county food bank during this emergency.

Three ambitious sewists, Jeannine Lonski, Dana Winston and Margaret Pemberton of East Brunswick, came to the rescue. They are sewing stylish masks to meet the current demand. These three, who wanted to make a difference, have now grown to a dozen sewists. A Facebook group was created, known as Mask Makers of MC, and more than 600 masks were distributed in the last three weeks. Requests for masks have been steady, and the group gives priority to healthcare providers or first responders. Other requests are fulfilled in a second tier.

There are numerous patterns and we attempt to send appropriate designs. There is no charge for the masks or the shipping/handling. The sewists have donated the fabric, thread, elastic, other supplies, and mostly their time and talent.
