The chefs presented 3 dishes each, and these were served to the 100 in-person guests at the event location, First Presbyterian Church. The chefs created healthy, nutritious dishes, and In the virtual presentation, each chef was interviewed and was able to display their cooking skills.

Judging was done on two tracks. Judges at the event were Chef Carolina Moratti, restaurant professional Jerome Mangroo and representatives from the Middlesex County Board of Commissioners. The live and virtual audiences voted for their favorites as well. Both votes resulted in **Chef Brian Karluk** being named the winning chef.

The history of Dine Below the Line starts in 2016 with a live dinner utilizing food pantry type ingredients cooked in gourmet fashion—displaying how fine food can be produced on a shoestring budget. This event's purpose is to educate people about food insecurity and how it is being addressed here in MIddlesex County.

Dine Below the Line is a partnership between Feeding Middlesex County and REPLENISH, the county food bank. Event sponsors were Magyar Bank and CME Associates. Thanks to the host, First Presbyterian Church of Metuchen, the event committee members, the church volunteers/servers and the live and virtual audiences representing the food insecurity stakeholders in our county.

Let's break down the stats:

- More than 250 vehicles pulled into the Park and Ride on Applegarth Road
- This resulted in 6,367 pounds of donated food and personal products collected
- Two vans of products went to the Monroe Food Pantry with the remainder to REPLENISH, the county food bank
- Over \$400 in cash was collected at the event and will go into the Feeding Middlesex County account in order to purchase food for REPLENISH

Thank you to Monroe, and to everyone in our Middlesex County community - you continue to show up and support however you can and we would not be able to help our food insecure neighbors without you.


